From the Pastor

What to Pray for Your Officers, Present and Future

Prayer is the pulse of the Christian. When a person has been placed under anesthetics while in surgery their heartbeat is constantly being monitored. It is important to check for a pulse because a pulse helps determine the presence of life. So also, those who have been given new spiritual life, those regenerated and "made alive together with Christ," will have the heartbeat of prayer. God's people are praying people. Sometimes we are more consistent in prayer and sometimes less. Sometimes we know what to pray for and sometimes we don't. However you are doing in your prayer life, prayer is a mark of the Christian life (see Luke 18:1 and 1 Thess 5:17).

Prayer is a vital part of the ministry of officers in Christ's Church for his people. Elders and deacons ought to pray frequently and firmly for the people whom they are called to serve. This is in following the example of Jesus, when he prayed that Peter's faith would not fail (Luke 22:31-32). Then, we find in Scripture that prayer ought to flow in two directions. Officers ought to pray for their people; and the people ought to pray for their officers. In each of his letters to the church in Thessalonica, Paul asks the believers to pray for him and those ministering with him— "Brothers, pray for us" (1 Thess 5:25, 2 Thess 3:1). Hebrews 13:18 calls for the same thing. As we move through nominating and electing new elders to serve the people of Northpointe, I thought it would be appropriate to remind us of this call to prayer.

You ought to pray for your officers, both those presently serving and those who will serve you in the future. One of my joys as a Christian father is the opportunity to pray with my children—prayer that sometimes includes praying for any future spouse of

my children. I cannot be certain that any or all of my children will get married one day. But I get to pray that if they do that their future spouse will love the Lord and seek to live out his or her faith in the home. I don't know who my children's future spouse might be, but I can pray to the God who does know. Likewise, we may not know at this moment who exactly the Lord is calling to serve as elders, but we can pray to the God who does—praying for them on their behalf. I will use the space remaining to highlight things for which to pray for your officers, both present and future. The below is a non-exhaustive starting

What to Prav

First, pray for the holiness of your elders. When Paul asks the believers to pray for him and fellow leaders in 1 Thess 5:25, it comes on the heels of his prayer for the complete sanctification of the believers. With sanctification in mind, Paul then asks the brothers to pray for him. Your elders are to be godly men, "above reproach," "lover[s] of good, self-controlled, upright, holy," and "gentle" (Titus 1:7, 8, 1 Tim 3:3). They are called to be men who love the Lord and seek to live lives of holiness as the Spirit continues to sanctify them. Pray for them to this end. Pray for their sexual purity, yes, and purity throughout the whole of their lives. Pray for their faith in Christ to stand firm to the end in the face of all manner of trials, temptations, and sorrows.

<u>Second, pray for the witness and fruitful-</u> <u>ness of your elders</u>. In 2 Thess 3:1, when Paul asks for prayer, he adds, "that the word of the Lord may speed ahead and be honored." Elders are to be faithful stewards of the mysteries of God. Both in word and in deed, officers are always ministering in the name of Christ and on his behalf—doing so as yet weak vessels, flawed, those still being sanctified. Pray that your elders would be faithful, bold witnesses on behalf of Christ and fruitful in their ministry among you, that they might be "the aroma of Christ" (2 Cor 2:15). Pray for their conversations and counsels, that they might be useful to God and effective among you.

Third, pray for your elders' love for Christ and his sheep. Rick Phillips writes, "A man can only succeed as an elder if he develops a love for the people of God that comes from the greater love of Jesus." Love for the flock of Christ must be the singular motive for ministering in his name and any sense of a desire to minister in his name. In his conversation with Peter, Jesus ties together love for Jesus with caring for the sheep (John 21:15-17). Pray that your officers might serve among you for the purpose of pleasing Christ and not man (please! this is a sneaky temptation for all officers and those nominated to office).

Fourth, pray for your elders in their homes. Serving as an officer demands sacrifices on time and resources. It can be spiritually and physically frustrating and exhausting at times. Pray for your elders' wives who support them. Pray for warm and fruitful hospitality. Pray that your elders would lead spiritually in the home with godly fervor, urgency, gentleness, and dignity (1 Tim 3:4-5). Pray that they would always bring to bear the gospel and the grace of Christ in all their interactions and conversations in the home, as they lead in demonstrating repentance, forgiveness, humility, and devotion to Christ.
